COURSE OVERVIEW

The Academic Success Program at the University of Richmond School of Law is designed to empower students to maximize their potential for success in law school and beyond. Our goal is to help students make the transition to law school easier by providing guidance about properly preparing for, engaging in, and reflecting upon their law school classes. First-year students will receive instruction on the skills necessary for success in the law classroom during Orientation week and several classes during the fall semester. Fall semester program topics include Case Reading, Case Briefing, Time Management, Outlining, Study Strategies, and Exam Preparation.

Student Learning Objectives: By the end of the course, students should be able to:

1. Demonstrate the ability to critically read and brief cases.
2. Demonstrate the ability to synthesize substantial material in preparation for exam study.
3. Demonstrate the ability to analyze and write essay answers.
4. Demonstrate the ability to critique multiple-choice questions.
5. Recognize their learning styles.
6. Demonstrate the ability to manage their time by creating and following a schedule; and
7. Demonstrate the ability to self-assess and make appropriate corrections in their study strategies.
